What Does Camera Inspection Reveal About Your Shower's Water Damage Severity?

The inspection workflow is systematic. First, we pressurize or flood-test the shower to reproduce the leak under controlled conditions while the camera records. This reveals whether the failure is in the pan itself, the grout lines, the waterproofing membrane, or the supply valve connection. Second, we navigate the camera horizontally behind the tile to map the extent of saturation in the substrate and wood framing. Third, we document findings at each stage—timestamps, depth, material affected, and proximity to electrical or structural components. This documentation is your proof of urgency.

What Does the Inspection Workflow Reveal About Water Migration Speed?

Not all leaks spread at the same rate. The diagnostic mapping process shows us whether water is trickling slowly through grout or gushing past a failed waterproofing barrier. The scoping sequence is the diagnostic roadmap that answers whether you call an emergency plumber at midnight or schedule a repair for business hours.
