

Lindenhurst has a rhythm that feels distinctly South Shore. You notice it in the way people move between the village center, the waterfront, and the neighborhood blocks lined with salt-touched siding and older homes that have seen a few storms come through. It is the kind of place where a house can look perfectly cared for from the curb and still be carrying a season's worth of pollen, road film, and algae on the north side.
