1. **Drop Rate**-- The probability of a case looking like a random drop is very low for some older cases. For instance, the Operation Bravo Case drops are approximately 0.15% compared to 1-- 2% for modern-day cases.
2. **Occasion Duration**-- Cases tied to limited-time operations (e.g., Bravo, Shattered Web) cease to be granted once the operation ends. This produces a difficult supply ceiling.

- **Steam Marketplace:** The main venue for purchasing cases outright. Costs are set by sellers; market fees apply.
- **Third-Party Trading Sites:** Platforms such as CSGOSkins.gg, Skinbay, or Buff.163 often list cases at slightly lower commissions, however verify seller credibility.
- **Community Giveaways & Events:** Occasionally, Valve or community influencers host free gifts where older cases are granted. Getting involved in main CS: GO tournaments can likewise yield legacy case drops.
- **Package Purchase:** Some collectors purchase "mystery boxes" that may contain older cases; nevertheless, this approach is risky and typically not cost-effective.
