

Relocating into a new place often reveals small security gaps, and old keys are usually the first item worth addressing. When the lock set is old or mismatched, a deadbolt installation or replacement can be more meaningful than cosmetic hardware changes. If a lock is loose, the deadbolt may not throw cleanly, and that can make an otherwise good door feel unreliable.
