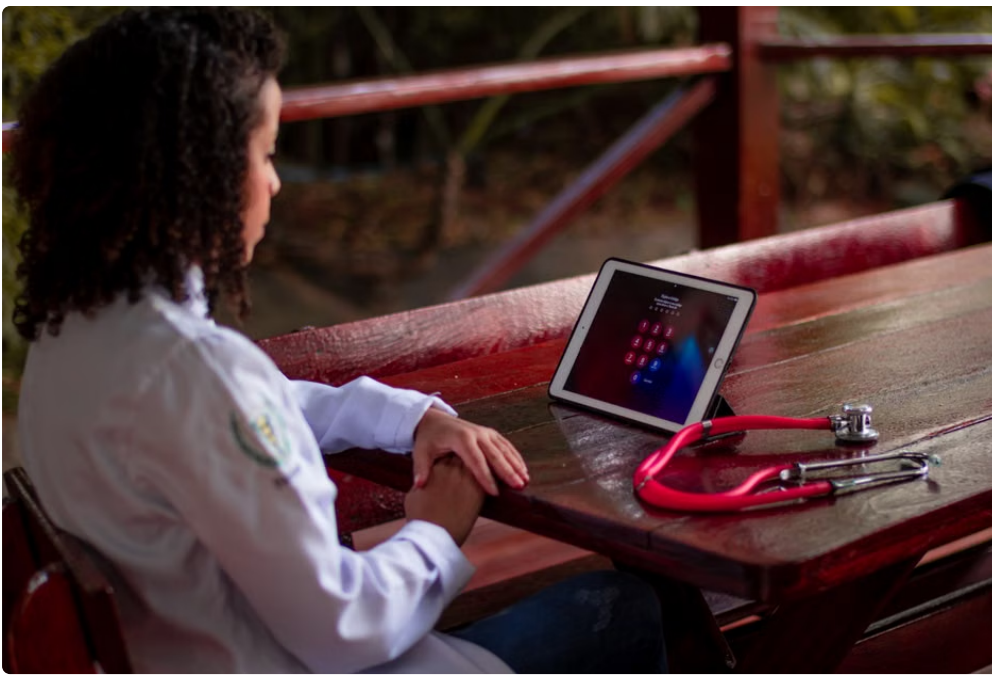

Step 2: Read Labels and Messages Carefully

Labels and messages in apps like Bingoplus are written to guide you, but many users overlook small details. This is especially true if you use tools like device display adjustments to increase font size or change screen contrast—sometimes text can overflow or become truncated.
