Comprehending Wear Ratings (Float Values)

No two skins are completely similar, thanks to the Float Value system. A float worth is a decimal number between **0.00 and 1.00** that determines how used or battle-scarred a skin looks.

Wear Category	Drift Value Range	Visual Characteristics
Factory New (FN)	0.00-- 0.07	Beautiful, very little to no scratches or blemishes.
Very Little Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Very slight wear, typically near the edges or high-friction locations.
Field-Tested (FT)	0.15-- 0.38	Obvious scratches, scuffs, and fading. Most typical category.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Considerable wear, heavy scratching, and noticeable paint loss.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45-- 1.00	Significantly weathered, in some cases completely modifying the weapon's look.

Note: Some skins are "capped," indicating they can not drop in Factory New condition (e.g., the AWP|Asiimov maxes out at Field-Tested).

StatTrak™ and Souvenirs

Players can likewise obtain special versions of skins:

- **StatTrak™**: Features an LCD counter ingrained in the weapon that tracks the number of kills made with that particular item.
- **Memento**: Dropped specifically during main Valve-sponsored esports competitions (Majors), including gold sticker labels of the groups and MVP of the round.

The CS2 Skin Economy: Why Do They Cost A Lot?

The economy surrounding CS2 skins is greatly driven by supply and demand. Because skins are gotten mostly through random drops, opening weapon cases with secrets, or trading, unusual items command incredible rates. Some famous knives and rare-patterned rifles have cost numerous countless dollars.

Several factors determine the worth of a CS2 skin:

1. **Rarity Tier:** Consumer (White), Industrial (Light Blue), Mil-Spec (Dark Blue), Restricted (Purple), Classified (Pink), Covert (Red), and Exceedingly Rare (Gold/Knives and Gloves).
2. **Float and Pattern Indexes:** Certain patterns (like the "Blue Gem" Case Hardened knife or the "Low Float" Crimson Web) are incredibly rare and valued by collectors.
3. **Pro Player Popularity:** If a prominent esports expert uses a specific skin throughout a Major, its demand typically surges.
4. **Discontinuation:** Skins from old operations or removed cases can no longer drop naturally, shrinking the supply while demand stays steady.
